As co-founder and artistic director of Denver's Theatre Under Glass, Margaret directed a variety of productions including RHI-NOCEROS, CYRANO DE BERGERAC, AM-ERICAN BUFFALO, and DOCTOR FAUSTUS. She has also directed the premiere productions of CONTRETEMPS by Michael Hulett and ONE LEAF FALLS and NEW KID ON THE BLOCK by Frank X. Hogan. She also directed BURIED CHILD by Sam Shepard, at the Town Hall Arts Center this July. A co-author of several plays for children, Margaret was also selected as guest director for the 1979 Chautauqua Touring production of THE SUBJECT WAS ROSES as sponsored by the Colorado Council On The Arts And Humanities. She is currently an instructor of creative lifestyle programs at Presbyterian/Saint Luke's Medical Center.

#### Mark McQuown

(Playwright, P.J.)

Mark was raised in Los Angeles where he earned an M.F.A. in Directing from the Univer-

sity of California at Los Angeles. He has acted in more than 80 productions and directed more than 65 plays as well as having been the director of the New Shakespeare Training Company in San Francisco, director of the Acting Division for the University of Colorado Theatre Department in Boulder and a teacher of acting on the west and east coasts. He divides his time among acting and directing in New York, a commercial and residential remodeling business in Colorado and, of course, writing plays. P.J. is his fourth play, but first production.
